Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students.

Firstly, I would like to thank you for all you have enabled us to do up until this time with contributions you have made.

Your financial contributions assist us with the purchasing of Art, Music, Library & Physical Education equipment and resources, which in turn, supports them to be exemplary programs. The environment and resources that we enjoy today represent the contributions made by our parent/carer community over many years.

Your support in 2024 has allowed us to provide high quality programs and specific subject materials and equipment for our Music, Art, PE, Maths & Sciences programs. With your help we have been able to maintain sufficient class sets of books for students to develop their reading skills, provide online digital subscriptions, provide individual student and bulk class supplies.

You have assisted us in expanding our ICT equipment in the school including adding another 100 Chromebooks to our laptop total. Many of our iPads are coming to the end of life and we are hoping to replace our supply so we can continue to enhance teaching and learning.

What we have at this school for our Outdoor Education Program is the envy of many secondary schools and exists only in very few primary schools. We have over 60 school bikes so that we can offer Bike Ed to Years 4, 5 & 6. The school has purchased stand up paddle boards, canoes, tents, camp marquee, cooking trailer and other trailers to transport all this equipment to camps. We are able to accommodate in excess of 120 students and staff on weeklong camps. Although our program is aimed predominantly at the upper level of primary school, all year levels access this equipment throughout the year.

Our School Council is proud of the excellent quality of our facilities and resources available for our students to enjoy and few schools match the numerous programs we offer to cater for students' needs and interests. However, these do not come without some extra costs involved.

In this current economic climate, it is becoming increasingly difficult to adequately fund our programs and purchase the necessary resources. I encourage you to continue to support our school's programs and resources by making your financial contribution as detailed overleaf. Without your goodwill and payment of voluntary contributions we will have to forgo some of the rich learning opportunities that our students have been provided with to develop their learning and passion for education.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES
